THE SITE

The subject site is described as Lot 1 on RP729475 and is situated at 611 Speewah Road, Speewah.

The subject site has an area of 20.86 hectares with frontages of approximately 500 metres to Speewah Road and 660 metres to Hoey Road. Both road frontages are formed to a rural road gravel standard. Access to the land is currently obtained via a single crossover off Speewah Road.


The subject land contains an established dwelling house which is located within a central cleared area. The balance of the subject site remains covered by remnant vegetation.

The subject land is zoned Rural under the Mareeba Shire Planning Scheme. Adjoining allotments are zoned Rural.

The development application seeks a Development Permit for Material Change of Use - Dwelling House (Secondary Dwelling) in accordance with the plans shown in **Attachment 1**.


