



Development of a heritage-listed, sawmill site in Mt Molloy to encourage cultural tourism.

This project aimed to improve accessibility and understanding of the remnants of the distinctive JM Johnston Sawmill site in Mt Molloy, which includes an old brick boiler, a Walker steam winch and a large Marshall engine.

The interpretive signage will inform the steady stream of visitors and tourists about the role that sawmilling played in the history of the region. Improvements to the heritage-listed site, also including roadside and safety signage make it an obvious visitor destination.

The site was officially launched in October 2021 with residents sharing their memories of the sawmill.
