The FRRR is currently providing grants to help communities access the resources they need to support one another through the ongoing effects of the drought impacting Queensland.

Grant provider	Foundation for Rural and Regional Renewal (FRRR)
Funding program	Tackling Tough Times Together (TTTT) (Round 9)
Availability of grant	Applications for Round 9 are now open and close on Friday 12 January, 2018.
Availability of funding	Grants up to \$15,000 are now available across most of Queensland. A small number of grants up to \$50,000 are available for larger-scale and multi-year projects that have a broader impact. Applicants for these larger grants must contact the Program Manager and submit an expression of interest.
Contribution	Financial or in-kind contributions from other sources are highly desirable and will be taken into account in assessing applications.
Eligibility	Funding is available for community groups and not-for-profit organisations with an ABN or Incorporation Certificate. Communities must be in a drought affected area and projects must have broad community benefit.
Objectives of program	The objectives of the TTTT grants are to: reduce social isolation by facilitating strong social cohesion and connection; and support and engage the community in leadership development and skills training.
Eligible projects	<p>Funding will support community-based activities that help to relieve current stressors and symptoms and build capacity and resilience for the future. Funds could also support activities that engage people in being active, exploring options and creating something that will stand the test of tough times.</p> <p>Priority will be given to projects that: are based in communities with a population fewer than 15,000; support and encourage community connectivity, wellbeing and resilience; or build community capacity to cope now and in future droughts.</p>
