#### **MAYOR'S MESSAGE**

The Annual Budget, as for any organisation, is notionally the most important document dealt with by Council in any given year.

The Budget underpins Council policy and direction and provides the community an insight into Council's immediate and long-term objectives. This Budget fulfils that obligation. Once again, the Mareeba Shire Council presents to the community a balanced Budget; finely attuned to the future direction of our community and staying within the bounds of the community's capacity to pay. These last four years have been a time for Council to establish clear vision for the future of the Shire and that of course includes safe and reliable water supplies, waste water treatment systems with the highest standard and transport infrastructure which is suitable for the purposes of the community. Today I present a budget which carries on that tradition with an eye to the future of our growing community.

Council has chosen to increase rates in this coming financial year by 2.5% to ensure that services provided to our community are equal to or better than those provided in the past.

Featured in this Budget are capital expenditure of \$19.2 million, maintenance of our roads and built facilities \$6.6 million and sporting and community beautification through parks and gardens of \$2.8 million. In this coming year \$1.9 million will be expended in Kuranda sourced from the Kuranda Infrastructure Fund as we push to improve and to maintain Kuranda as a premier tourism destination.

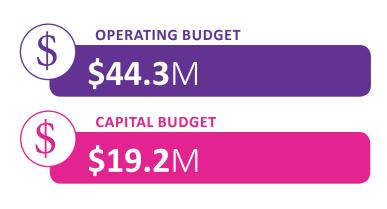


Upgrade. A project to deliver enhancements to car parking in Railway Avenue this year, will cater for our growing customer base and RV market and improve the amenity of Mareeba.
